1) Tour of University of Helsinki City Centre Campus and Oodi Library

The multidisciplinary City Centre Campus in the very heart of Helsinki is the largest campus of the University of Helsinki with its approx. 17 000 students. The City Centre Campus houses the Faculty of Educational Sciences, the Faculty of Arts, the Faculty of Theology, the Faculty of Law and the Faculty of Social Sciences as well as the Swedish School of Social Science.



Helsinki Central Library Oodi is a living meeting place at Kansalaistori square, right at the heart of Helsinki. The library building consists almost entirely of public space and offers a wide selection of services. Oodi is a venue for events, a house of reading and a diverse urban experience.

2) Visit to Helsinki City Museum and Children's town exhibition

In Children's Town, Helsinki's past is illustrated by means of play and joint activities. In Children's Town, visitors can learn more about Helsinki's history through own experiences and joint activities.
